LCRTA is an active chapter of over two hundred members with an active group of officers and standing committees. ### HISTORY OF LCRTA

The Licking County Retired Teachers Association was organized in June 1954. Two of the names on the roster at that meeting were Mayor R. W. Swank, former Newark High School teacher, and Lester Black, former Superintendent of Licking County Schools. Members include retirees from the ten local school districts as well as those who taught outside Licking County.

Members contributed to help restore the interior of the old Cornell School, a one-room school built in 1886 in the Johnstown District. Members continue to volunteer many hours of their time giving Licking County the benefit of their leadership skills.

A Student Award Fund (now known as the Fran Alspach Scholarship), funded by donations from members, was established in 1988 to grant a scholarship annually to a student from one of the ten school districts in Licking County. The Letha Headlee Scholarship Fund, funded with money willed to LCRTA began awarding scholarships in 2002.

The purpose of the Newsletter is to keep members informed of the legislative concerns that affect retired teachers and to provide other information of interest to members.
